Officer Reports

really well. Several things coming up including Long & Short, which is only two months away so we need to get started on volunteer meetings. It is great that we have so many volunteers at and before but we need volunteers to help with tear down. Every minute helps. We did not get of site until after 5. There was only 5 helping at the end. I also delivered the newly repaired and repainted parking signs Baron Alail has refurbished (receipt will be presented this evening for \$5.40 for the materials) to come out of my budget. Yesterday, Their Excellencies returned many items to the shed, including the baronial pavilion. I have all of the feast-related items yet to return, as I have one to exhibit tonight, and, well, Monday. I believe we are good on the serving items and cookware

items I took out for the weekend; I was involved in the cleanup of the kitchen and some of the packing, and I did periodic checks for our things. I donated two small white milk glass apple serving dishes to the barony which I packed in with the serving ware, with the intent of being used for the high table. The item I wish to speak of is the rice cooker. I have used it successfully in the past, but now it is in epic fail mode. We have Constance von Bern to thank for rescuing us with her rice-cooking skills. I have brought the rice cooker for two reasons: one, in case anyone here wishes to donate the scrap metal for a favoured charity (we have one, our backfence neighbor, who collects scrap metal for the food drive for the church we sometimes go to, in the likely event no one wants to bother). Two, I'd like to obtain a new one, as close to this one as we can get; and in case anybody has an unloved rice cooker that was a Christmas gift, or wishes to purchase one to donate, I have the model I'm trying to replace here. It's a good one, it cleans up easily and well; and it is great to have because it's like another kitchenmaid you can put to work on one chore & keep a burner free (often really important in a kitchen just as we had this past weekend). Otherwise, I would like to request that the financial committee approve my request to buy one. The top end ones go for about \$70. I want a robust, heavy duty one for the purpose it is used for. I am not aware of any other major failures of baronial equipment. A minor one is that another of the custom-made Terra Pomaria condiment cups chipped,

but we knew that would happen. Next month I will request that Thistillium Pottery be contacted to produce another one for us to replace the chipped one at \$5. So The Shed. During our most recent visit, we discussed again some of the items in there. The obelisks from September Crown 2009 remain large heavy objects taking up a lot of space that are difficult to move around. I haven't set them up myself, but I understand that the hardware, the metal fasteners, were removed by Sir Ruland and Lucas von Brandenburg for other projects; so if we wanted to use them, we'd have to buy more fasteners. Nobody has any plans to use them that I'm aware of; so what I'd like to do is set one up, photograph it, find some photos from September Crown 2009, possibly, and offer them for sale to some of the larger baronies (Madrone, Dragon's Lair, 3M for something like big Crown tournaments or equestrian events) or possibly the Kingdom with the specific intent of storing them at the West An Tir War site for war site signage. I believe that this offers the best opportunity for both removing the obelisks from The Shed without simply dismantling them, and for seeing that they actually get used for a practical purpose. It would be nice if we could recoup a little of the money we spent on them for use on other baronial material purchases - like rice cookers.

Librarian:

There isn't much new stuff as far as the library is concerned. Still in boxes. Still planning to get the reports to the new seneschal. Stuff

Heavy Marshall:

Good evening everyone, What a great month for fighters in the Barony! Last month we had a troupe of our fighters head up to Vancouver, WA practice to spur more Mid Willamette attendance. Photos will be taken and uploaded soon, just as soon as Bar Gemels laundry is finished.

Scribe-

In lieu of Scribal Night in March, an applique class was held by Berte, organized by HE Ainslee Goldheart. It was attended by 15 artisans and resulted in 19 applique bags being created and donated for largesse as of reporting time. At Ceilidh on April 13th, the financial committee approved funds to enable a paper order. 20 sheets will be ordered, resulting in 80 charter blanks. It is my goal to have a small buffer of painted charters as well as a moderate stock of charter blanks for original scrolls as needed by their Excellencies. Scribal Night returned on April 15th and was attended by four artisans other than myself. Artisans are painting

Scribal Night in May will be held on the 20th at the Ike Box from 7-9pm. Suggested she check with Francesca about teaching beginning calligraphy class. Also looking for teachers for design and detail.
