Chamberlain: The past month has been quiet. We still have 11 kitchen utensils checked out to Countess Berengaria de Montefort de Carcassone and 5 lights checked out to Sir William Brennan. We have received a donations of 8 pillars that were previously used as decorations at the most recent March Coronet we hosted. Some of them will be used as decoration at Martinmas, but we will likely not be able to keep all of them due to space. Currently they take up every inch of available space in the shed which makes it hard to get to needed items. I'll be discussing options with the seneschal and exchequer.

Librarian: I hope everyone's doing well. Nothing new to report with the library itself. I'm mostly waiting to see the outcome of who the new librarian is so I can get the books all packed up and taken to them. Lady Blackwolf stepped up as applicant and introduced herself. She stepped out and discussion commenced. Approval was carried.

Heavy Marshall: We have been having an increasing number of participants at the weekly practice. Two new fighters vying for the loaner armor, a new to the area fighter (who fights both heavy and rapier, I'll try not to hold that against him), and someone returning after several years absence. All in all fun times. The good news is that no injuries were reported! Enthusiastically seeking a replacement.

Rapier Marshall: Practices dropped down to an average of 4 fighters a practice due to the heat. There

were no major rule changes. For once there are no upcoming activities scheduled for the next month. Golden Apple was held on the 8th. It was a test of the format to be used in the Rapier Championship at Martinmas. The victor was Levi Grimes. I have attached the MIC report from the demo that happened last month on the day the August report was due. Alail add that rules for QRC will be VERY Strict, so read the rules.

During the last month I've run or assisted with consulting tables at two events: Lebus and Acorn War. Between the two, I've worked with six clients, though a bit of followup is still underway. Best possible way to spend a Saturday. As of now, the

call is officially out for someone else to step up as Baronial Herald! Please bear in mind that a lot of what I do in this office is just for my own entertainment – you don't have to have any experience at all in the subject matter to be a wonderful and effective officer. Here's a list of what being the herald actually requires:

- * Submit a brief monthly report.
- * Submit a quarterly report, which is basically just all three monthlies tied up in a bow.
- * Before each of our barony's three events a year, designate a herald in charge. It can be you, but it doesn't have to be!
- * After each event, make sure a list of any awards given by the barony gets sent to the OP.
- * Have a mental list of people who know how to do a town cry, field heraldry, court heraldry, and book heraldry.
- * Learn any of the above skills you like, at whatever pace works for you; gleefully delegate the rest.

That's all! You do NOT need prior experience with any of this; you just have to plan ahead and be willing to learn. One of the best things about my tenure in this position has been how incredibly willing to help the barony has been. For example, I'm comfortable with book and court heraldry, but even after two years I try to find other volunteers for field and town cry. People have been extremely generous about stepping up when I need them to, and have been very kind when correcting my inevitable mistakes. And of course, you can certainly consider me a

resource! I'll still be around, but I promise I won't barge in and step on your toes unasked. All in all, if you have any level of comfort with public speaking, and if you can be counted on to submit a couple sentences of updates a month, you can do this job. Our Current Baronial Thrones have the following dimensions (not written by a carpenter!); Seat 22"x18"

Seat height 17" from ground; Chair back 48" tall; Arms 27" from ground; These measurements are for reference only and are by no means a restriction or requirement for the bid.

Shed project – have some stones from Radomir and getting more from Fortune's family. Still could use more. Once weather permits a work party to install.

Signs – no progress

Bar Gemels - Oct 11th is deadline. If no bids will be canceled. If so a one day small scale event will happen to do championships that are required.

New Business

Kingdom event-have not hosted since 2009. We have a lot of options. Would like to see this happen, but with out staff for our local events does not want to move forward with it. How can we get more stewards. Discussion ensued. There are many people willing to be supervising stewards. There are resources, just ask! Events are not written in stone. You can change things up.

Discussion of sites and costs. We

would like bids to show the range of costs. Explore all options and to see what we can do to rejuvenate our events. We do not necessarily need to do a specific event or theme. If you want to do it differently, it is okay. She challenges everybody, find a site come up with an idea.

Site discovery committee – There are check lists uploaded to the files section of the Facebook and they are available on the An Tir Autocrats webpage along with many other highly useful tools and resources. His Royal Excellency Tjorkill Kanne made an excellent statement at Moot this past weekend regarding contact with Site Owners. We are a society of courtesy and chivalry who was once one of the most sought after groups for site rentals. Sadly this has changed, but there is no reason it needs to stay that way.

Treat all site owners/ representatives with courtesy, even when faced with a "NO", if they have requirements or demands send them to me and I can at least attempt to work with them. Please remember that every contract must be reviewed by the Seneschal, even if there is a designated Signee, and occasionally contracts may be referred up the chain for review as well.
