Finance Committee Minutes

May 19-21 2013

Meeting started at 11:02 p.m. on May 19, 2013 with an e-mail sent to George and Cherie Beatie, Vernon Pierce, Matthew Schultz, Meredith Alden and Denise Van Dyke:

Greetings Baron Peder,
Baroness Ainslee and nobles
of Terra Pomaria. I present
myself Berte le Webbere,
your humble servant, in
consideration to be Steward
for Martinmas this November
16th, 2013. I have received
acknowledgment from Lindis
De Aquisgranno that she is
willing to serve as mentor to
this effort.

When the fields are clear and as summer draws to a close, let us gather together to celebrate the achievements of the season. I plan to present a variety of activities to entertain us for the day. There will be the Rapier and A & S Championships, a prize rapier tournament, classes and children's activities. To end the day a feast.

I would like to offer a simple day board for lunch; the cost to be included in the site fee. The site fee will be \$10 for adults, \$5 for youth and those under 12 free. There will be a family cap of \$30 plus NMS as applicable. There will be a separate \$10 fee for the feast. The \$5 NMS charge will

apply to this event.

I have found a lovely site at Oregon Christian Convention, 5605 Jubilee Dr SE, Turner OR. It is a mere 15 minutes off of I-5 and very easy to find. Included in this proposal is a conservative estimate of income and possible expenses. I used the figures from our two previous Winter's End and then rounded down to a break even point of 50 attendees. I believe our attendance will be a number around 60 or 70, which would put us in profit.

Attached to the e-mail was an event proposal listing an estimated attendance of 50 adults, 2 youths, and 40 feast fees for a total of 910 in estimated income. The budget included site cost (\$500), food (\$300), prizes (\$50), misc (\$50). \$200 of the site cost listed is a refundable deposit. In the case that the site deposit was not returned, this would leave the event making a \$10

profit on the "break even" budget.

A suggestion was made to raise the site fee to \$12 due to concerns that the profit margin was too tight.

The meeting was suspended at 7:00 pm May 21, 2013, to be taken up during the business meeting.

[The financial committee concerns about the budget were addressed by Berte at the business meeting. \$200 of the site cost is a refundable deposit and the attendance of 50 is very conservative, as Winter's End attendance was usually above 75. The bid was approved with the original \$10 site fee.]

The comp list was approved as it was in compliance with the finance policy and customary. It was noted that one member disagreed with the comps listed within the finance policy and customary but approved the list as it was in line with the current policy.



May 28-June 4, 2013

Meeting started on May 28, 2013 at 8:27 pm, when Traci Earhart forwarded an e-mail request from Cherie Beatie to the finance

committee. The message was sent to Vern Pierce, Meredith Alden, George and Cherie Beatie, Matt Schultz, Denise Van Dyke as voting members of the committee. It was also sent to Melanie Mitchell for meeting minutes.

Cherie notified the committee that wood needed to be purchased to repair the broken beams for the baronial pavilion. We have a list of the wood needed, but we do not know how much that lumber is going to cost and nor time to gather the costs. The lumber is needed immediately as the baronial pavilion is needed at several upcoming events. George and Cherie requested permission to purchase the lumber.

It was noted that this is a clear and present safety concern and suggested the committee approve the expense, but put an upper limit on what might be an automatically approved amount.

There are 3 pieces needed. 1 @ 11'1" x 2.5" x 3.5" and 2 pieces that are 9'8" x 2.5" x 2.5". They are not your average cuts. They are in "quarter cuts" meaning your average

2"x4" type measurements don't work. There is also a length issue and that it should be hardwoods for durability. These are not common off the rack sizes. Cherie said they would be contacting several discount builder supply places that have in the past carried similar odd sized things.

Most of the lumber may need to be trimmed/planned down to a closer to right size as well as sanding and sealing.

Cherie has made one call so far. They recommended 2 different hardwoods that would be more weather tolerant. Mahogany, Ash, and white oak. They are out of Ash. And the others run \$6.95 and 10.95 a board foot.

Using those numbers, approx. \$215 and \$340 would be a ballpark range. \$250 was suggested for a maximum for automatic reimbursement. If the cost comes in higher than \$250, then the committee would re-evaluate the cost. If the extra cost is justified, then they can approve reimbursement beyond \$250. The measure was passed with three votes when the meeting closed on June 4, 2013 at 2:38 am.



Chronicler's Correction: The portion of the lawsuit reimbursement approved at the April business meeting to give to the Principality of the Summits was listed incorrectly as 30% in the May Privy. The correct amount was \$502. I apologize for the error.

Officer Reports

Seneschal: I became a little concerned at Bar Gemels watching a child leaving the eric with people that were not their parents. In that case the person had spoken permission from the child's parent, but it was concerning, and I did some checking to find out how it should be handled. Events in general, NOT youth activities specifically: Children below the age of 12 need to be within sight and hearing of a parent or a designated adult. A little note is required if they will be with a designated adult other than their legal guardian and their legal guardian is on site, saying that person is the responsible adult for that child. If the parent won't be on site, there is a specific medical waiver that is required and can be found on the kingdom website. News from May Crown: 1) There is a great new youth and family achievement programaugmenting the page program. Reporting is going through the family activities coordinator/seneschal. 2) Crier copy is often getting turned in incomplete. Please make sure to check the crier copy guidelines to make sure that you are including everything you need when submitting Crier Copy. 3) There has been a rash of events that has been neglecting to assign a Marshal-in-Charge. Please make sure to assign one and put their name on your final report. 4) Fire arts-Fireworks, firebreathing, firedancing etc. Don't do any of it at events. The only way to do it is to get permission from the Society Seneschal and the current one has said outright

he will not give permission. 5) There is a new seneschal's handbook out. 6) The new crown prince and princess are leuan and Gwyneth Gower. There were 94 fighters in the tournament. 57 of them were preregistered and that made the process go much smoother. There were, I think, 7 Inspirational Equality pairings, including the first all male fighter and inspiration couple. 7) An Tir Kingdom Feast will be November 1-3 in Ocean Shores, WA at the Shilo Inn. They are giving us a group rate of \$89 a night. It should be pretty spectacular if you are interested.

Please make sure that if you are bringing items to an event you make sure to take it with you or make arrangements for someone else to take it. Bar Gemels had a couple of different sets of items that there appeared to be a disconnect on who was taking it home and it was quite a trick for the event stewards to get everything off site.

There were 7 Pelicans, 1 Knight, 1 Laurel put on vigil at May Crown. The peers were quite busy at Crown!

Exchequer: Statement balance as of 4/30/13 was \$6398.20. Our balance as of 5/20/2013 is \$9450.20, \$574.57 of which is lthra's. This gives us a balance of \$8875.63.

Chamberlain: Egen repainted the barrier and it looked pretty great. I want to reiterate what the seneschal said about making sure the items get



returned after events. Their
Excellencies are getting a problem
fixed with the baronial pavilion. The
joints are buckling and they are
working with Alysaundre from
Adiantum to get that corrected.

Librarian-VACANT: no current interest.

Heavy Marshall: Bar Gemels was fantastic. Egen put on a fantastic tournament. No injuries all month. We have 3 fighters that are interested in learning heavy fighting and want to put a kit together. It's not a problem to get people kitted with pickle barrel armor right now. We had 14 heavy fighters and 10 rapier fighters at the Mid-Willamette 2 weeks ago. There were 8 knights and a prince there. There were people from all over. Golden Apple was put off until next month as I (last month's winner) could not be there. The Prize will be a locally made Thor's hammer pendant and it will be awesome.

Rapier Marshall: Absent-practice is proceeding well under the watchful eye of our new junior marshals Magdalena and Alistair, with a record 9 rapier combatants at last practice.

Don Christien (the Barony's rapier champion) did a wonderful job organizing the rapier activities at BarGemels. The tournament and classes were a great success, with Don Talentus, Queen's Rapier Champion, winning the tournament.

A Beginner's Guide to Aledieval Cooking

A beginner's guide to medieval cooking by Baroness Jehanne de Huguenin of Drachenwald

1. Things to avoid

Remember that a lot of the ingredients we take for granted in modern cooking are new world species which entered European traditions well after 1600. Out-of-period ingredients you should NOT use include:

- · potatoes (use turnips instead)
- · tomatoes
- · green or red peppers
- · chocolate (unless you're drinking it as a spiced, unsweetened drink in late period)
- · sweetcorn
- turkey (unless you're cooking late period Marx Rumpolt has a whole lot of recipes, and there are some in the Elizabethan collections)

and many others I've doubtless left out.

2. Distinctive aspects of medieval cuisine.

These are broad generalisations - not all time periods and places will show all these characteristics.

- · Spices. Pepper, ginger, cinnamon, nutmeg, galingale, saffron, cubebs, etc.
- · Sugar is often used as a spice in savoury dishes.

- · Herbs, including some unfamiliar ones. Parsley is often used in large quantities. Coriander and mint are common in Arabic dishes. Tansy, fennel, rue, hyssop are all herbs found in medieval recipes.
- · Salad herbs such as rocket, beet greens, turnip greens, spinach.
- · The use of vinegar or verjuice
- the use of dried fruit (currents, raisins, dates, etc) in meat dishes
- the tendency to cook both meat, vegetables and starch in a meat broth - often "good, fat bacon" is specified.
- The use of almond milk (ground almonds and broth, making a thick whitish liquid which is strained and used as a milk substitute on fast days. It acts partially as a thickening agent).
- The use of breadcrumbs or soaked bread as a thickening agent. The basic roux sauce (milk thickened with flour) is unknown in our period.

3. Making familiar foods look period

Even if you do not have access to authentic recipes, there are some simple ways of making basic foodstuffs appear more period, or "perioid".

- · Avoid New World foods! (See list of things to avoid, above).
- Remember that the use of a fork was unknown until very late in period. Foods were usually cut small so that they could be eaten with a spoon, or, if left in large chunks, were eaten with the fingers and a knife. If you think of the practicalities of SCA dining, it's very difficult to eat large chunks of meat which have been cooked in a sauce, in your fingers. Sauces were often served separately (I assume you'd dip your piece of meat as you ate), or meat was cut up into broths which could be eaten with a spoon.
- Try serving a simple medieval sauce (garlic sauce or cameline sauce) with a plain roast chicken or other piece of
- · Some foods are period but were served in certain ways only. Medieval pasta

recipes are either for filled ravioli cooked in broth, or for basic noodles cooked in broth and layered with cheese. A cream or tomato-based pasta sauce is NOT medieval, but it's perfectly simple to cook a pasta dish which is.

- Pies are period! So are quiche-style egg tarts. Meat pies with currents or dates are common in period recipes.
- Desserts? Many medieval feast menus suggest that you finish the meal with nuts, oranges and spiced wine. Avoid any cake or biscuit which needs a raising agent, but custard pies, apple pies with dried fruit, fruit fritters, etc, are all period.

4. Cooking for vegetarians.

It would have been rare for people in the medieval age to be vegetarian, unless they were particularly holy religious figures. However, we have a large number of vegetarian recipes from our period because of the church-enforced fast days several days a week, as well as Lent. There were different types of fast days; some forbade all meat or animal products, while others allowed eggs and milk. Fish was not considered meat and could be eaten on fast days. A basic quiche dish with onions, cheese and eggs appears in several medieval sources as "A tart for Ember Day".
