Prizes for Heavy Tourney, Rapier Tourney, Archery, A&S

Cheri-I didn't put in a day fee but have since heard complaints. I would like to put in a day fee. Simon-I think if you are having activities on more than one day, it makes sense to have a day fee. If you are having activities on only one day, you shouldn't have a separate fee than an event fee. There's the twilight tourney Friday

and possibly the griffin quest tourney Sunday.

Consensus is to have a day trip fee for Bar Gemels. Majority of committee agreed that the day fee should be the same on both Saturday and Sunday. Melanie proposes that we return to the adult fee of 18 weekend, 12 day fee. Consensus agrees that bid is approved with the revision of adult fee to \$18 weekend, \$12 day fee, youth day fee of \$7, children's day fee of \$5 and addition of \$5 per cabin bed fee.

Income \$4770 – Expenses \$3255 = \$1515 estimated profit (main difference being the \$5 cabin fee which is our normal practice at this site.)

Meredith asked whether the branch or society pays for background checks. Melanie confirmed it is society. Which background checks we should do will be discussed at another time as it is beyond the scope of this meeting.

No Archery bid yet. DRF has been put in. Simon will propose bid through e-mail later.

No Martinmas bid. Bera was given a hard and fast deadline of 7/9/11 and Meredith did not receive it.

Changing Banks:

Simon did not like the atmosphere at Chase. They didn't seem to want our business. US Bank didn't want to help either. MAPS was willing to bend over backwards. They said the only thing that might be a problem is the signer sheet. She said the long distance signer (principality exchequer) might have to take the paper into a bank and sign it in front of a notary. MAPS has a branch all over our territory except Lincoln City. That is important due to deposits in general and specifically deposits of event income. We will be required to open a savings account (\$5). Unanimous vote to change to MAPS.

Secure thumb drive:

Meredith would like to get a secure thumb drive for the seneschal. She is digitizing as many of the seneschal documentation as possible and wants to hand it to next seneschal in secure format. It is \$30. Simon advised her that is within her monthly budget of \$50.

Hospitality Table:

Meredith made proposal of hospitality table for August Ithra. It would cost about \$35 if we have two coffee urns in the shed. Ainslee noted that one of the coffee urns was no longer working at the end of Bar Gemels. Unanimous approval. Michael says there are three urns in the shed not including the broken one. Michael will ask Francesca to check which one or more is working.

Laptop:

Simon proposes getting a new laptop. This one is 10 years old. The computer I propose buying would be \$330 It would come with Windows. I can do everything I need for the exchequer with it and OpenOffice

except Microsoft Office. Quickbooks would be about \$140. Quickbooks would be better for us than Quicken. It has a number pad. I would like the \$40 for the case. I would also like to get a warranty. Two 2-year warranty options, decent warranty or coverage of the same items and damage due to dropping or exposure to liquids etc... Total proposal \$559.98 or \$668.98 with extended warranty.

Michael suggests that we put the computer on the to-do list for the budget process so we can find out what other officers need. Meredith-or we could wait and look at sales in August or Holidays. Simon-Our current computer has Windows XP on it. XP will not be supported and will be open to lots of viruses in 2013. We need to do it by the end of the year. Meredith: How much do we expect the budgets for officers to change? Simon: People haven't been using them. Meredith: Also, we are looking at changing baronial storage, getting new thrones, eric poles etc... Discussion of possible expenses ensues. Determined the only new expense before end of year would probably be eric poles.

Vote comes down to 4 options, 1) buy now, 2) wait for budget (unknown amount), 3) emergency expense when it dies 4) see if we can get a lower price at August back to school sales. George Beatie was called in California, given situation by Meridith and he voted as well. 3 committee

votes for option 1)buy now, 1 vote for 2) wait for budgetary meeting, 1 abstain (Simon-whose office will receive the computer).

Ithra fund:

Meredith asked if there is anything else we need to do as financial committee for dedicated fund for Ithra. Consensus is that we accept the funds for Ithra and put a 5 year expiration on it. After the 5 year time limit if they have not been able to set up a local Ithra bank account we will return it to the Ithra Southsound Campus. Simon will discuss the particulars with Sharon Kidder (sca name Sarra Peller) and bursar (John Louis Vifian).

Revisiting Tithes:

Melanie-we also need to revisit the amounts we wanted to tithe to kingdom, principality, travel fund etc... we intended in January, before the settlement payment sent the budget off kilter, to pay kingdom \$110, \$220 to summits general fund, \$50 to summits travel fund. Summits travel fund is doing pretty well, per Meredith. An Tir has not noted problems with budget but Summits general fund is very low. Michael proposes \$100 to kingdom and \$100 to Summits. Consensus approves.

Meeting adjourned at 9:12 pm.

Meeting started 7:05 pm

Baron and Baronessa:

An Tir West War was a good time. It was lightly attended comparatively. The weather was fantastic. An Tir won on Saturday.

Seneschal:

Reminder about quarterly reports, due August 1st. They may not seem that important, but they are the first thing mentioned at Summits Moot and Curia. I need electronic copies of SCA Membership cards and ID cards. The Membership cards are due to

corporate requirements and ID cards are in case officers are in possession of baronial property. Some are missing and I think it is best to move to electronic copies where possible.

Exchequer:

\$7532.74 Bank balance \$8597.72. We had a financial committee meeting. We decided to tithe \$100 to kingdom and principality. We will be leaving Bank of America and going to MAPS (and there was much re-joining). We decided to replace the excheq-

uer computer. I have already purchased it and managed to save \$60 off the original bid. The computer itself was \$299. The computer that we had will be going to the Chronicler. We also voted to approve a \$35 hospitality table for Ithra.

Chamberlain:

Nothing new to report.

Librarian:

Nothing new to report.

Marshal:

Due to change in jobs I have missed several practices. Weylyn has been covering them as well as my lady who has become a junior marshal. Last Thursday's practice was extremely well attended. MidWillamette was nonexistent due to war. Golden Apple is this Thursday.

Rapier Marshal: OPEN

Report from our Rapier Champion "As Baronial Rapier Champion I will make Baronial Rapier Reports until the Barony gets a Baronial Rapier Marshal. Sorry about not having a June report, I thought Alail had filled the position.

- Long and Short of It (02 June) Sir Alail Horsefriend served as Field Marshal. Rapier: we had five fighters, Don Luciano defeated Msgr. Chrestien in the finals. Reduced Armour Experiment was in use. Rapier Melee: The two Dons defeated the three other fighters. Cut and Thrust: Demonstration with three fighters.
- Mid-Valley Rapier Practice (07 June) Three fighters in attendance. - Mid-Valley Rapier Practice (05 July) No practice because of An Tir / West War.
- Baronial Rapier Kit: No progress. Probably safe to assume that it is all gone. Minimum kit needed: two masks, multiple pairs of gloves, two jackets (more sizes the better), two gorgets, two hoods (these could be fitted to the masks), two rapiers, one dagger, one buckler, one cloak, tool

kit, copy of the Rapier ABCs, bag(s) for all.

- Baronial Rapier Marshal: I believe Sir Alail Horsefriend is interested in the position."

Seneschal noted Alail is interested and has sent in a resume, but is not able to be here today. For now she will let our champion know that we still need his help filling in.



List Minister:

Nothing to report. No Membership card yet. Problem with receiving it via mail and website is not finding it through the current address. (Mathea recommended that she look it up through the credit card transaction ID that she got through website.) I will be at Golden Apple Thursday. Golden Apple last month was won by Peder.

Archery Marshal: OPEN

No one currently interested. No one is warranted as an archery marshal at business meeting. Simon is in process of getting warranted as a junior marshal but not able to take the office.

Equestrian Marshal: Absent.

- Ithra-August 25-Finally have site contract signed off. We are legitimately allowed to have fire at Western Oregon. We will be doing lamp-work beads and pewter casting. Chancellor is Sarra Peller. As soon as we have a final class schedule I will be spamming the lists. I will let you know when registration is open. Please contact Sarra if you want to teach. Barony will have a hospitality table. This has been approved by financial committee. We'll need to put up signs for parking etc. We will have to do gate. Class fees and reimbursement of teachers will be handled through exchequer's office. Many of those payments will be done in advance. Registrar should be able to hand people packets and have them sign waivers.
- State fair-August 26th, 11 am-7 pm. We have a limited number of free passes. 8 people total. Ji'lid and Fortune, Ulf and Duessa, Mariotta have volunteered. I would like to make sure that the free passes go to people that will commit to 4 hours. Need Demo boards and pamphlet and tablecloths. I am working on something to avoid Demo boards having issues with wind. We cannot have any kind of weapons. I will be able to have videos of fighting. I need STUFF! I need volunteers and need to turn in names before August 1st! Berta suggested zip ties for Baronial banners or other demo boards. Discussion ensued regarding some kind of newcomers gathering after the Demo. Fortune and Torston will discuss offline.
- Archery Championship-no bid in yet. Simon visited a site with the Baron and Baronessa. It is just south of Monmouth. Agricultural land will be harvested by the day of the event. He is willing to rent for nothing. He just wants money toward an extra cleaning of the biffie on site. If we

have more people we can get more biffies in future. Owner is excited, and willing to put on garb and come down an shoot. Tons of parking and easy to set up safety zone. He would be open to equestrian and/or a weekend event.

- Martinmas—no bid and no site. We will not be having Martinmas this year to avoid burnout of our officers and volunteers. We are not “married” to the name if someone wants to open it up to other ideas. If we want it at UUCS we need to reserve ASAP as that is why we lost the site. Discussion ensued regarding available sites. Torsten requested the Winter's End book to start looking into a bid.
- Bar Gemels April 26-28 2013- financial committee approved Ainslee's bid. The vision for this year's event is to have a theme centered around the days of the Pas d'Arms in the 13th and 14th century. The idea is to tie in all the activities around this theme. A torchlight tourney, if possible, could be cen-

tered on the seedier side of town, perhaps a thieves tourney. Archery and rapier to be determined by their respective marshals. A possible A&S competition could be for best use of heraldry in garb (shields etc don't count) which would allow the whole populace to compete if they chose. Potential classes could be Silk banner painting or an embellishment class. And of course what tavern would be complete without beer and what better way to celebrate that than with a brewing competition.

- Long & Short 2013-taking bids.



Old Business:

- Griffon's quest fundraising. We are required to do so as we had the griffon's quest tourney. Simon-There will be a request for donations at the Archery Tournament I am bidding on.—Francesca-need to discuss fundraising (in general) separately.
- Equestrian-We don't have any events that are suitable for Equestrian. Brigit wants us to make sure that we don't want to end up feeling “stuck” with **having** to do Equestrian at a specific event. She wants us to be extremely careful that we don't lock in an event where we feel we have to do it. It is so hard to find

sites for equestrian. Francesca recommends that we try a separate equestrian event that is a day event for all but the horse owners. It would be every other year or something like that, to get it off and running but not make it a requirement.

New business:
