

April 14, 2013 Financial committee meeting

In attendance: Cheri Beatie, Vern Pierce, Meredith Alden, Melanie Mitchell and Robin Giles. Meeting minutes taken by: Melanie Mitchell. Meeting Started: 2:20 pm.

Vern: So far we are doing pretty good on on quarterly budgets. For Ceilidh: we have spent \$250 of the \$400 budget. We didn't use all of our budget last year, due to contract changes. We will use more than our normal budget this year to accommodate the contract changes from last year. Very little has been spent of officer budgets. We haven't brought in any money in the first quarter. The coffee stop monies were deposited in April.

(Coffee Stop-brought in just shy of \$200. Mathea is pretty sure more than \$50 was spent, although we haven't received reimbursement request, but there is a huge amount of stuff left over that can be rolled over to Bar Gemels or the Chatelaine's supplies. We need to plan better in the future, as there was a lot of over purchasing. Mathea is not sure it is worth keeping the stop open in the wee hours of the morning, but we don't have to. It is a potentially viable option for fund-raising in the future. Mathea is now on their mailing list. We had a higher quality of product than than others groups do, and there was good feedback.)

The quarterly report is done. I sent off the stuff for our financial policy. I just need to print off a form and mail it to the Kingdom exchequer.

The cash box is going to cost about \$30, and I need to order it. It was previously approved as an expense, but it was not purchased. Vern, Cheri, and Meredith voted to approve the expense.

Ben Mitchell, the first aid officer, has put in a request for an emergency treatment cot for \$130. The cost is about \$30 more than the regular cots, and a cot is extremely helpful for exhaustion, heat exhaustion, treatment for something on the feet or legs. He liked that the head or foot could be inclined and someone could be strapped to it and used as a litter. These types of treatments are standard first aid, per Cheri. Vern, Cheri, and Meredith voted to approve the expense.

We got numbers from the Principality for the lawsuit reimbursement. They are returning \$1502. The Principality has requested that we donate some or all of the reimbursement to the Principality General Fund. We originally donated

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\$1581. Mathea suggested that we put it to the populace, saying we will give them between 30-60% and suggest 50%.

Cheri and Vern discussed the cashbox policies and how money would be handled at Bar Gemels.

We have one bid for coronets from Vrin. The sketch is gorgeous. It will be \$1100. It is not adjustable. Making it adjustable would raise the price. The device can be changed easily if we do change it in the future. Cheri will request bids from Alail and Tjorkill. If they do not want to submit bids, we will look to the Summits for bids.

Mathea proposes that we start a dedicated fund for regalia. It would be for regalia, maintenance of regalia, materials to make regalia, etc. She also proposes that we use the remainder from the lawsuit reimbursements to seed this fund. Cheri, Vern, and Mathea voted to approve the start of the dedicated fund and used the remainder of the lawsuit reimbursement to be the seed.

Meeting ended 3:31 pm.

(Chronicler's note: After this meeting the Baroness realized that the bid amount for the coronets provided in the meeting was incorrect. The \$1100 was for materials only. The final bid was \$2200. The correct amount was provided to the officers at the following business meeting.)

Baron and Baronessa's Opening Words: This last month was fairly slow as we did not attend as many events as the month before. Ceilidh was well received, although the baron was unable to attend. The event season is underway. Please volunteer whenever you are able. People will be needed at gate, kitchen, setup and tear down etc.

Officer Reports

Seneschal: Quarterly reports are due at the end of this month; please send them to your Principality superiors and Cc me at . Many thanks to Duvessa, Egen, Ulf, Fortune, and

Kenji, who have already gotten their reports in.

I'm still in need of bids for the Prelude to War, Martinmas, and Spring Coronet 2014 events. There are some proposals in the works, but nothing formal yet. If anyone has any ideas or is interested in helping on any of these events, please come





talk to me.

I want to remind everyone that all members of the populace are welcome at business meetings as long as everyone is polite and respectful toward everyone else.

Duvessa has been promoted to Principality Youth Armor Marshall, so that position is open. Also, Gold Key is still open. If anyone is interested in these two positions please let me know.

Exchequer: Statement balance as of 3/31/13was \$7438.01. Our balance as of 4/15/2013 is \$7282.42, \$574.57 of which is Ithra's. Which gives us a balance of \$6863.44. So far the officers have spent very little of their budgets. I will try to inform the officers who have spent money, how much they have spent and how much is left.

Spending was approved for a \$30 cashbox, and a \$130 patient cot for the Chirurgeon. The finance committee would also like to start a dedicated fund for a regalia fund to pay for maintaining and replacing regalia.

We got numbers from the Principality for the lawsuit reimbursement. They are returning \$1502. The Principality has requested that we donate some or all of the reimbursement to the **Principality General**

Fund. We originally donated \$1581. The finance committee would like to give 30-60% to the Principality and would like feedback regarding how much to give.

Much discussion ensued. Final consensus was to give 30% back to the Principality and use the rest to be the seed money for a regalia fund to pay for maintaining and replacing regalia. We will consider upping our regular tithing when the finance committee discusses that again.

Chamberlain: I have started invento-

rying the shed. I am expecting a whole bunch of requests to get items in the shed for Bar Gemels. If you have shed requests this week, call or text me, as I will not be able to check e-mail often. Librarian-VACANT: no current interest.
