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



Baron and Baronessa's Opening Words:

Crown was a lot of fun. We are trying to have a large open area for Terra Pomaria to be able to camp with us at every event we camp at. We are doing this at Coronet as well. You don't need to have a period tent. At Coronet, we will have the baronial pavilion on the eric and both fighters and other populace are welcome to use the shade. Martinmas is coming up. Please remember to submit recommendations, baronial, principality, and kingdom! We will also be accepting letters of intent for the sargeantry program. Thank you all for sending in your reports and copying the baron and baroness.

Officer Reports

Seneschal: Lately, I have been dismayed at the delays that we have encountered in planning events. Our pool of available event stewards is small to begin with, and seems to be shrinking all the time. Even in the cases where we do have an event steward, we seem to constantly be running up against deadlines and ending up in panic mode. The worst part about this trend is that delay takes away our choices. We end up in situations where the site is already booked, we have no wiggle-room to negotiate with a site, or events and activities have to be canceled altogether.

Running an event is not scary! Event stewards work in a team, so you never have to be stuck out on a limb alone. You can get your friends together and make it fun. There are many people in this barony who are ready to step up and help. The event steward is more of a coordinator and planner than trying to do it all yourself. A pair of stewards is a chance for less experienced stewards to learn from those who are more experienced, regardless of who the steward of record is. If you have a more "ad hoc" team, that's okay, too. I'm willing to be flexible and work with whatever setup you have.

Multiple bids for an event are also welcome. It gives us options and choices.

Let your inspiration guide you. If you have an idea of something that you love or something you want to do for your Baroness, you can build it up into an event or get together with a friend who has an event idea and work with them to make the activity happen. I want people to have fun. Yes, there are some rules that have to be followed, but overall, we've got lots of flexibility. If you have questions or are anxious, talk to me! I can help you! If you don't have much in the way of ideas, you can ask the Baron and Baroness what they would like to see.

A suggestion was made to re-institute the deadlines listed in the customary at 9 months before the event and then 6 months before the event if no bids come in. This way there is a visible deadline to help motivate those that are considering bidding, and we have the opportunity to hopefully receive multiple deadlines and choose between them. The suggestion was adopted and Melannei will add the deadlines to the business meeting notes.

Exchequer: Statement balance as of 8/30/13 was \$10,389.44. Our balance as of 9/15/13 is \$10340.14, \$574.57 of

which is Ithra's. We also have \$1000 in the Regalia fund. This gives us a general fund balance of \$8765.57.

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Chamberlain: Absent. Nothing to report for September, posted proposal for Regalia Committee to Facebook group.

Librarian-VACANT: Amira is interested and is working on setting up her garage with shelves etc. She is not ready to take the office at this time.

Heavy Marshall: Last month Golden Apple was canceled due to lack of participation. This Thursday will be Golden Apple. It will be "bring your best". Coronet is coming up and we have a massive amount of people going. It's wonderful to see people supporting our fighters in crown or coronet. Next Thursday Peder will be the Sr Heavy Marshall at fighter practice as I will be out of town. I very close to having two bags of loaner gear, where all they will need is sword and shield. No injuries at all this month. We are losing one of our fighters, Griffith, for about a year.

Rapier Marshall: As I have been unable to attend practice for the past month I have no report other than that the Barony has added one more rapier fighters, HL Andrew Crowe who recently moved here from the Barony of Adiantum.

Deputy: Everything's going great, averaging 4 to 6 fighters at practice. I have the start for a Golden Apple "trophy" . We (the rapier fighters) were thinking of having the tourney on a different day then the heavy fighters, so that our "cross trainers" can participate in both tournaments. Haven't set a date, yet. Because I failed to send out the email in a timely fashion, the deadline for A&S Championship letters of intent has been pushed forward to the 18th of October. I encourage everyone to enter! The A&S championship is coming up at Martinmas in November; everyone is encouraged to compete. Letters of intent should be sent to me and to the Baron and Baroness; I would like to receive them by no later than the 18th of October. The format will be thus: Minimum of two entries from two different categories--brewing, leatherwork, clothing, embroidery. One may be a pure research paper if desired. More entries are encouraged, but you will be scored by the two best entries. Documentation is required for all entries. Judging will be by a panel of (hopefully) three judges, picked for their knowledge of the entries. You must be present at your display during the judging, as you will be asked questions and asked to demonstrate any active portions of your display. Any special equipment required for your display-stoves, tools, etc--must be supplied by you. Please contact me with any questions, or to sent your letter of intent.

I'm looking forward to seeing the entries! Don't be intimidated; the documentation part isn't nearly as difficult as people imagine and can actually be fun.

Anyone who wishes to teach something at an A&S day, or who has a topic to request, please get in touch with me. I am still looking for a replacement. I have a contingency deputy but she cannot take the A&S position.

Chirurgeon: VACANT. No current interest. If you are interested contact Kenji or Mathea.



Family Activities Coordinator: Nothing to report.




Our Baron and Weylyn Middleson strolling through site at Setember Coronet. Photo by: Kenji

Event Reports

Prelude to War August 9-11, 2013: Well, Prelude is all wrapped up. Unfortunately, because of low attendance, we lost a considerable amount of money. We had expenditures of \$1207.80, and income of \$420.00, for a total loss of \$787.80.

Things that could have been done differently: I should have pushed advertising more heavily. I think this was the single largest contributing factor to the loss. Having a deputy event steward to handle some of the details would



have helped as well. I overestimated the number of attendees to expect, and based facilities on getting significantly higher attendance. Also, I should have clarified that we had exclusive use of the site, as we had several unexpected mundanes left over from the music festival. 46 people through the gate, including comps.

Pros: The site was free, and the site owners loved us. We, as usual, left the site cleaner than we found it. The site owners would love to have us back in future years. And according to the attendees, everyone seemed to have fun.

Once again I want to thank everyone who helped, including but by no means limited to Ainslee, Mathea, Berengaria, Alail, Elena, Melannei, all the teachers, all the fighters, all the people who came to take classes or camp work or just have fun.



point is 120 adults. The site is the Polk County fairgrounds main building, but we don't know enough about the site because Bera has had a great deal of trouble getting in touch with the site. Amira indicated that she has access to land that abuts the Polk County fairgrounds and if necessary we can put tents on that land. Mathea will get her in touch with event stewards.

Bar Gemels April 25-27, 2014: The bid submitted by Melannei Athenaios has been accepted by the finance committee A summary of bid follows:

Bar Gemels had a fabulous year last year and it is my hope that we can keep the momentum going in 2014. I have been listening to the voices of the populace, and I hear enthusiasm for many of the new activities tried at Bar Gemels, but I also hear grief at the loss of some traditions that have been left behind in the process. I will do my best to bring the best of both worlds, providing the tavern atmosphere with the "doesn't take itself too seriously" feel that Bar Gemels is known for. Games will be available to play in the tavern, and the bar wench smackdown and possibly the bar brawl will have their place on the schedule. I hope to include a bardic in the evening as well. Of course, the Youth Championship would be showcased! I am also hoping to provide a variety of classes and activities, including rapier, archery, and YAC.

With the same fees as last year, minus the child site fees, at 150 adults and 12 youths (split evenly between weekend and daytrip) I estimate that the income after expenses would be \$392. The main difference in expenses on my bid compared to last years is the addition of a biffie at each cabin, to be more in compliance with our contract with Camp Taloali.

I want to note, this bid is a pessimistic forecast for the event. The attendance numbers listed here are lower than all but one of the three recent years that I have access to. (2010, 2011, 2013) It is my hope that with early planning and

advertising, the attendance will be higher than forecasted. The kitchen has always broken even, as I listed in the bid, but two of the three years it made \$500. I figured pessimistically, as this will be a new feast steward, after at least 4 years of the fabulous (but exhausted) Mhairi.

The EIF is nearly done, and my plan for this month is to get the main players in my staff lined up and the contract signed. Fortune verch Thomas has offered to be my pre-reg coordinator, but I still need a gate coordinator and chirurgeon and I'll be talking to our officers about their availability. For their respective positions at the event. Also, offering the bar wench smackdown and the bar brawl are dependent on finding enthusiastic volunteers to run them. Some concern about lack of participation in the past bar brawls was mentioned.

Suggestions were made for a torchlight tourney and the pas d'armes. Baron and Baroness would like to introduce a bardic championship at Bar Gemels.

Discussion was had regarding holding a YAC championship at Bar Gemels. Decision was made to put YAC championship on a different event than youth championship, probably Long & Short. Baron and Baroness will talk to Duvessa about whether she feels the YAC community has grown enough for championship.

If YAC activities, need a difference YAC officer than Duvessa most likely, but she would be able to put us in touch with the appropriate people.

Long & Short-June 6-8 2014: Bids are due December 13, 2013 (Friday before business meeting). Some interest in bidding. Adair park has been used twice and is a great option, but please put 10% of profit to Cour du Val in your bid if you choose the site.

Prelude to War August 8-10, 2014: Date is tentative. Next year is Adiantum's turn but it would be good to have a liaison to coordinate with them.

HWY coffee stop fundraiser: Tabled, until after the heavy event season ends.


