# Finance Committee Minutes

Traci requested responses as soon as possible to the following request:


At the request of the Baron and Baroness I researched the preservation of our Origination charter. This is the charter that granted Terra Pomaria the status of Canton. It is a hand drawn, painted and calligraphied piece by one of our founding members. Unfortunately the years have NOT been kind to it. It is currently in a broken frame, backed by bad cardboard held in by masking tape. There is no glass. Due to this there is some water damage in a spot, the paper has been roughed up, the seal is cracked, and the paper is yellowing. I have sprayed acid remover on it to prevent further yellowing of the paper, but a frame shop need to address the rest. I have Gone to Michael's and their frame shop



and received a bid for the framing and further preservation of this very important document.







Let me be very very blunt right now. There is a HUGE sale at Michael's that ends on Saturday. I need approval of this request by Friday evening so I can get this done and save us a lot of money.

The bid is for the framing, double matting with spacers, museum sealing on the back and 99% UV protected Glass on the front. Please realize that this document

is a very very weird size and is a great example of why we create this things in standard sizes now.

Original price for these items: \$445.90

Sale Price: 160.52

As you can see the price difference is significant. I have attached pictures so you can see some of the damage, the current condition of the charter, and the choice of matt and frame. I did my best to keep it as cheap as possible, but still have it look good. Yes I picked out of the lowest price range on both the mattes and the frame. The spacers are there to accommodate the seal.

Please please please please help us preserve this treasure before it is lost.

The request for \$160.52 to preserve the origination charter for Terra Pomaria was approved by the finance committee.

The new budget was approved by the finance committee. All budgets will remain the same except for Chatelaine which is now \$250 and Ceilidh site which is now \$480. Meeting ended December 16, 2013 at 12:02 am.

#### Baron and Baronessa's Opening

Words: I hope everyone enjoyed Investiture. We weren't able to go. We are going into the new year. We had a great year. We have a lot of events coming up this season. We have a lot of officers that have their terms coming up. If you are interested in an office, please contact that officer to find out about the job. Officers, please be thinking about your successors.

#### Officer Reports

**Seneschal:** The end of the fourth quarter is upon us, and I would like to remind all officers that quarterly reports will be due by January 31. I also encourage submitting those reports early, because it's easier to remember what happened within

the quarter and not get it mixed up with more recent developments.

I am still looking for a deputy to train and eventually succeed me.

Both the Exchequer's and Seneschal's terms will end in April of 2014. It would be a Very Good Idea to not have the Exchequer and Seneschal both change over at the same time. How does the populace want to handle the changing of the officers? While both of us have contingency deputies, neither of us have designated successors. Both of us are willing to continue our terms in office for a year, subject to a renewed warrant from Principality. We can both continue on, but how do we avoid this fix again next year?

The seneschal and exchequer stepped out and the officers discussed what the best solution would be. The officers' decision

was that we will request an extension for both officers and and there needs to be a change over of one at 6 months after term end and one at 12 months. It does not matter to the officers which one goes first. This will give both officers more time to recruit successors, but not have them switch at the same time.

Exchequer: Statement balance as of 11/30/13 was \$9532.94. Our balance as of 12/16/13 is \$8960.57, \$574.57 of which is Ithra's. We also have \$1000 in the Regalia fund. This gives us a general fund balance of \$7386.00 The financial committee has approved a new budget. The cost of Ceilidh went up and the Chatelaine's budget will go to \$250. There has been an large increase for printing pamphlets.

I am going to send messages out to several people who have not cashed checks written by the barony. Cash them, have me rewrite them or tell me to donate it to the barony.

Chamberlain: Nothing much to report this month, after the busy time of early November. I am going to try to schedule the first Regalia Committee meeting this week.

After receiving no volunteers for the "at large" member, I approached Lady Leora the Red, who had been extraordinarily



helpful and wise this summer in proposing a list of possible regalia projects to put into the hopper; after due consideration of the responsibilities alongside her modern schedule, she has accepted (and currently holds no other office nor deputyship), so we are at full complement.

My only other item is that I would like to ask to borrow the barony's rice cooker and slow cooker next weekend as I journey out to the Shire of Tymberhavene to cook part of the Feast of St. Ductus. Mathea will create a least agreement and send it to Bera (renting for \$1).

**Librarian**-VACANT: Amira is not here, but is interested. Milda is also interested and will send an SCA/modern resume to the seneschal.

Heavy Marshall: This month we haven't practiced... at all.. Last Practice with heavy fighters was the week before thanksgiving. Needless to say no injuries to report. So far it looks like this week is still a go, if that changes I'll notify the populace on Facebook.

I have been talking with Baron Peder about the possibility of changing our practice site to a different location. Specifically we are looking into the national guard base here in Salem. We are waiting on word back from Ji'lid about that being a possibility. I ask the business meeting to suggest any spots they can think of that are in doors with concrete floors lighting and a bathroom. Heat would be good too. This possible change is due to how open to the elements our current spot is now. When we have a hard rain our courts flood, no bathrooms, and lack of heat is a put off for both rapier and heavy fighters in my opinion.

I may be canceling next Thursday due to Yule. I will know more after talking with everyone this up coming practice. Once again ill notify the populace if we are canceling.

Alail Horsefriend is stepping down as Baronial Rapier Marshal. I am willing to take over the office, if no one else is interested.

**Equestrian Marshall:** Absent. No report but equestrian is on hiatus until spring.

Youth Combat Marshall: VACANT.

#### Bar Gemels April 25-27, 2014:

Everything is going well. I have the biffies scheduled. The site has



# KAPPE

## 15th Century German Fringed Hat

Hat or Kappe - The fringed hat, or Kappe, shows up in late 15th century German sources, particularly in Nuremburg. These caps show up in many artist's drawings; Master of the Housebook, Durer...etc. Although there is some variation, they are all fringed caps. The main construction is a wool tube with fringe at one end. There is often a turned up brim at the forehead as well.




**Evidence** - Although there are no extant examples of this hat, there are enough images to give a reasonable idea how the basic hat was constructed. The flopped over top on many of the images of this style shows that the hat is not shaped to the head, thus the tube. The large amount of fringe on some of the hats (fig. 1) is an indicator to me that a double layer could be present. The hat would have also been wool as other hats of its kind for warmth. Using a fulled wool removes the necessity of finishing the fringed ends, as in other extant garments with dags in fulled wool that were left unfinished.









#### **Pattern**

The hat itself is very easy to make and can be made out of fairly small pieces of wool. Even sewing my cap entirely by hand, it took me less than an hour.

## Cutting

To make the hat you will need a piece of wool, lightly or heavily fulled (I recommend lightly fulled as your fringe will drape better). The piece should be 30" long by your head measurement plus 1" for seam allowance.

For example: my head is 21.5", so my rectangle was 30" x 22.5"

## Assembly

Take your piece of fabric and pin the long ends (30" sides) together and sew the seam of your choice to make a tube. The trick is to start and end the seam about 5" in from each end to allow for fringe (see diagram).

Now, cut the ends of the tube into thin strips to make fringe. How wide is up to you, but you will want to aim for half an inch to an inch depending on how thin/wide you want your fringe.

Pull one end of the fringe down through the middle and match the fringe up on the other side (folding in half by pulling one side inside). Now, fold up the end away from the fringe a little to make a jaunty brim and voila! You have a hat.
