Trade Blanket

My lords and ladies pray attend!

On the next Ceilidh, November 13th, I, Lady Magdelena, will be hosting a trade blanket!

When and where you ask? At our Monthly Celidh 7:00 p.m. at Salem Heights Hall, 3505 Liberty Rd S, Salem, OR 97302

The full explanation of the rules will be done before we start. Here's what you need to know before arrival.

Bring gently used or hand made objects, or supplies to trade. Items to be considered should have some relevancy to SCA.

A short list of items traded for at trade blanket: amber, drinking horns, jewelry, glass vessels, glass beads, hand dyed yarn, hand spun yarn, yarns, ceramics, hand bound books, reference books, armor, roving, fabric, trim, salve, shoes, boxes, benches, chairs, fire tools, furs, blankets, clothing, socks/mittens, wire, chainmail, hats, beeswax, pickles, jam, belts, cloaks, etc.

DON'T show your hand!There is a significant amount of strategy to getting a good trade. Keep your stuff in a box or sack, so you can surprise people with really good trades for something you want. Keep something big-ticket in your box in case something big-ticket that you WANT comes up. Also hold back a few really good small items for sweetners, so that you can close a deal on items you really want.

DO remember, this is a social event, a time to nosh, whisper, try to drive bargains, and generally socialize with other people who make cool items.

DO bring lots of little things, both as sweeteners, and to put out as trades for beginners.

Expect a wide range of items.

If you are new, or have never participated in a trade blanket, please come anyway.

Use this as a time to get to know some of our awesome craft-makers.

Calligraphy Class

Greetings Terra Pomaria! This month at our regular scribal night we have a guest Teacher!

Alicia du Bois has offered to teach us Calligraphy! Below you will find the class description.

Remember that our scribal night is the third Wednesday of each month. This month is is November 15th. It will be held at Young at Art, 1255 Broadway NE Ste. 190 Salem, OR 97301. You can be there as Early as 6pm. Class will start at 6:30pm.

Name of Class: Beginning Calligraphy - Gothic

Textura

Length of Class: 2 hours

Number of students: up to 15.

Students of any age who are willing to listen and learn are welcome. This class is very hands-on.

Description of class:

Learn the fundamentals of calligraphy: what it is and how to do it. We will go over basic terms and supplies, talk about setting up your workspace and practicing basic strokes and learning Gothic Textura. A brief overview of best practices and materials for further learning will also be discussed.

Class cost includes a dip pen with 2mm nib, a small jar of ink, paper, and a handout with ductus and guidelines. Practice paper will also be provided and we will clean nibs at the end.

Cost: Students should bring \$8 to cover supplies.

Students can also bring their own 2mm pen and ink. I'll still provide handout and practice paper for \$1.

Wreath Making

A wreath is an assortment of flowers, leaves, fruits, twigs or various materials that is constructed to resemble a ring. Wreaths have much history and symbolism associated with them. They are usually made from evergreens and symbolize strength, as evergreens last even throughout the harshest winters. The Romans and Celts, for example, all considered the evergreen to be an important symbol of the continuity of life, protection, and future prosperity as it was one of the only trees to stay green during the bleak, "lifeless" winter months. Fir, cedar, and pine boughs and wreaths were used to decorate homes.

Small gifts for the gods representing the sun, earth, and harvest also were hung from the branches of pine trees in groves. Some people believe this custom evolved into the Christian tradition of

decorating an evergreen tree in December.

We will be crafting wreaths or "swags" (depending on your personal aesthetic and skill) and decorating them with ribbons and ornaments in the traditions of the past. As reminder and a promise to ourselves and those around us that though Winter is strong, bleak, and dark, it is not forever.

Receipes From Martinmas

Apple Tarts

Filling

2 lb apples

½ cup white wine

3 T sugar

¼ tsp sugar

Tart Shell

8 T butter

3 T sugar

¼ tsp salt

1 1/4 cup flour

Peel, core and slice the apples. Put them in a pan with the wine and cook until soft.

Remove from heat and mash slightly. Mix in sugar and cinnamon and place into a tart pan

Shell

Mix the butter, sugar, salt and flour by hand until a soft dough forms. Sprinkle the dough over the bottom of a tart pan and using the bottom of a measuring cup, evenly press the dough into the bottom and the side of the pan.

Chill for 30 minutes

Prick with a fork and bake at 350 for 20 minutes. Remove and let cool. Add filling and bake at 350 for 30 minutes.

Onions with Cheese

Large Onions

Shredded cheese

Vegetable oil

Cover a pan with vegetable oil, and slice onions into steaks, 6 steaks per onion.

Lay onions on pan and roast 350 for approximately 10 minutes until translucent

Take onions out, sprinkle cheese on top and bake until cheese is melted and slightly browned.

I feel apologies are in order. As some have noticed I have been less active on the Baronial side of things as of late. I am currently dealing with some troubling medical issues that need my focus. As such I will be leaning on my deputies and possibly others to take point on certain tasks. That said, this past weekend I was part of a potential site walk through led by our own Klovis the Cook. Along with Mountain's Edge,



Three Mountains, and Stromgard we looked at 3 potential event sites in the Molalla area. While this is technically outside of our borders these sites have great potential for Kingdom level or joint branch events in the future.

However, I am much disturbed to report that I was privy to Three Mountain's Baron making remarks about claiming our Klovis and Mindy. Information to hold on to in case future actions must be taken.

I will be attending the Seneschal and Exchequer training on Saturday in Couer du Val, I encourage everyone to attend these classes. Even if you are only mildly curious about these offices, you will meet some of the finest people our Principality has to offer.

There are some reminders I have placed with our new business.

Demos –We have the possibility of 2 school demos in the upcoming months, but no dates or details yet.

Social Media – VACANT – Nothing to report. Accepting applicants, please send an email to myself and their Excellencies expressing your interest in the position.

Family Activities Coordinator – As of today I think all tokens have been accounted for via paperwork and given out. The OP is being updated this week.

Parents are responsible to go into their family account and Mark completed in their children's badges/worksheets. I collect the worksheets and send them to kingdom. Between kingdom Principality and myself we make sure that the OP is updated. If the parents do not mark complete online the OP won't be updated. An Tir is leading the way in the YAFA program and



as such we need to come up with fundraisers for the program so it is sustained.

Tokens are \$5 each. Kingdom has asked that each area come up with fund raisers to help pay for the tokens. This was discussed way before the fundraising efforts for kingdom award medallions was started.

So, the first fund raiser for Summits in general will be at Martinmas. The lunch will be a potluck. The populace brings food for lunch to be shared and a donation box or jar will be available to put donations in. The money will go directly towards the YAFA program in the Summits to help pay for tokens.

As far as token count: Central An Tir has given out 52/Tir Righ 4/Summits 62- all but 3 of those have been Terra Pomaria children.

I am working on getting different classes set up throughout Ceilidh season. Some will be YAFA some will just be for the fun of it. Some the Seargentry candidates can help. A request has been made to please do the gingerbread house building thing again at the December Ceilidh. Basically, the parents are going to ask their kids what they'd like to do. making that happen.

Background checks: There is a change. People who are requesting to be a mentor, but not an officer, are being processed in a different way. There is a separate form which I have access to.

If the person wants to be an officer, they go through our Seneschal. If they want to be a mentor, they start with me or the Principality YAFA officer.

The mentor form is forwarded to the person and cc'd to the Terra Pomaria Seneschal (as a courtesy and is not required) and the Kingdom YAFA officer. The mentor form must be filled out and marked mentor. The mentor form needs to be sent to Corporate. Corporate will then have it processed and notify the mentor directly by mail if they passed.

The reason for the change: Kingdom pays \$0 for mentor's background checks.

Officer background checks are still done the way they have always been done before. This is new as of Sept Crown so it hasn't been shared everywhere yet but will be soon. This is the approved per Corporate and Kingdom way to do it.

Parents are allowed to mentor

their own children and at level 1 a mentor is not required. However, the local officer is to quiz the child to make sure they have adequate knowledge of the subject before agreeing it is completed, without the parents explaining or helping. (Case by case basis) That goes for all levels. Being the officer and having children in the program I am having the mentors grill my kids. They aren't just getting by. They must know this stuff otherwise they did not earn it. They're the local guinea pigs. So, if you think an item may not be age appropriate let me know and we can test it out and make suggested changes.

There are some tokens that do not have worksheets. If you are willing to help create them please let me know. There is a special group working on that.

Some worksheets don't have tokens we are working on that.

Tokens themselves are copyright protected and the SCA has a contract with the manufacturer. Please do not embroider or carve replacement tokens.

Replacements can be requested.

Martinmas. The plan is to have the children who are interested to help in the kitchen as much as possible. We need bread kneaded and lettuce ripped apart. These are things any child can easily do if they want to. Afterwards we will have games and coloring and blocks set up. If I can get it ready we might have a subtlety decorating thing. Like painting cookies or decorating a cake or something like that. There will be candy to stick onto something. Let's put it that way.

Ulf is working on Coronet kids activities. I want to get all the kids activity stuff out of the shed and take it to Coronet so everyone of all ages has something to do
