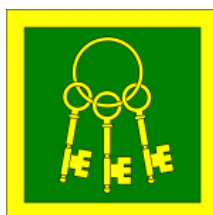

Eventing season is almost here! Are you combat ready? Come to the March Marshalate where we will be learning, authorizing, and readying for the Tournaments and Wars ahead!



- This event will focus on: **Armored Rapier, Cut & Thrust, and Youth Armored Combat.**

Each area of focus will cover the Marshalling basics through hands on learning with the goal of certification in your chosen field:

- Junior Marshal – Jr. Marshals are a key part of this Historical game we all love. It only takes a day to learn the basics and you'll be ready to help keep our fighters safe. Plus, marshals have the best seat in the house!
- Senior Marshal – Already a Jr. Marshal with experience in tournament, war, or practice combat? Become a Sr. Marshal! Sr. Marshals are who keep fighters authorized and train Jr. Marshals. Step up your game!



- Youth Armored Combat Marshal – YAC is going extinct! How are we expected to raise the next generation of stealthy combatants if we don't start training them young? Plus, the littler ones sleep like a rock when their all worn out. Come learn how you can contribute to the revitalization of this mighty, and adorable, field of action!
- Fighter (Re)Authorization – Yes, we need fighters here too! The “hands-on” approach can only happen if we have fighters to put our hands on... wait, that's not right. Well, you get the idea. Whether you are new to fighting, need to get re-authorized, have new armor you need to have checked, or are a fighter who wants to see what all this “marshalling” stuff is about, bring your kit and we'll see what we can do! You'll be serving as a key part of the Marshal Training process AND you'll be ready to participate in the upcoming Coronets, Crowns, Championships, and Wars!

A few key things:

- **This event is free to attend!** That's right, free! The focus is on getting folks educated and authorized to support the Marshal Arts. To help with that, we are not charging a site fee. Please be sure to

still bring any necessary identification, membership card, fighter card, etc. as we will still need to sign folks in at gate.

- **Donations will be accepted.** We will have a donation box on site and happily accept any donations you wish to give to support this wonderful event that helps keep our game safely going. All donations will go towards the support of Marshalate activities (like this one and the next one coming this summer for Equestrian, Archery, Thrown Weapons, and Siege).
- **Parking is limited – Please, please, pretty please Share Your Ride.** Due to the nature of soggy fields this time of year, parking will be limited, very limited. Carpool, Vanpool, Buspool, just share. There will be a small drop off area for loading/unloading and accessibility.
- **No Animals Allowed** – this is a functioning horse facility. For the safety of all, no other animals are allowed on site (service dogs excepted, on leash w/owners at all times).
- **No Smoking** – at the request of the site, please.

This is a casual event, Garb is not required but is encouraged. Please wear appropriate closed toed shoes. We will have some water and snacks. Please bring whatever food and specialty hydration items you wish to have.

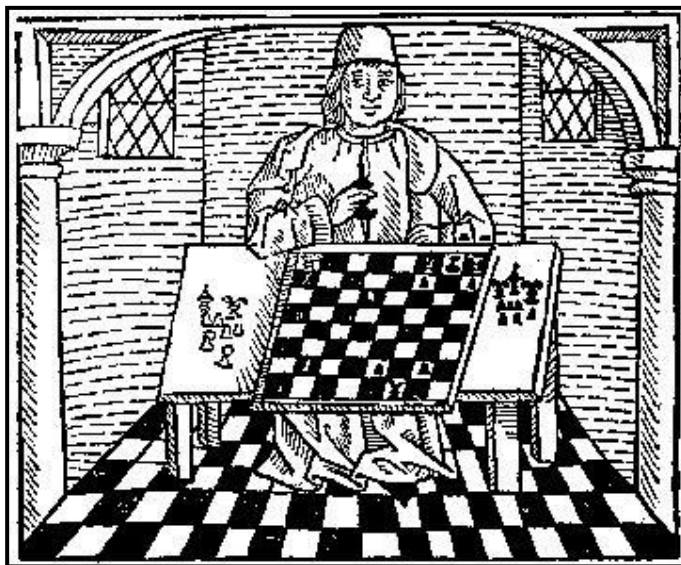
Bar Gemels News

Medieval Recipes

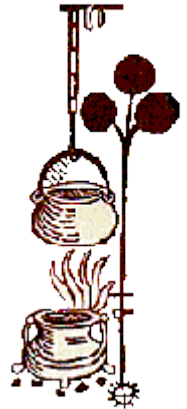
Tart de brymlent (Fish & fruit pie)

PERIOD: England, 14th century | SOURCE: Forme of Cury | CLASS: Authentic

ORIGINAL RECEIPT:

175. Tart de brymlent. Take fyges & raysouns, & waisshe hem in wyne, and grinde hem smale with apples & peres clene ypiked. Take hem vp and cast hem in a pot wip wyne and sugur. Take calwer samoun ysode, oper codlyng oper haddok, & bray hem smal, & do þerto white powdours & hoole spices & salt, & seep it. And whanne it is sode ynowgh, take it vp and do it in a vessel, and lat it kele. Make a ciffyn an ynche depe & do þe fars þerin. Plaunt it above with prunes damysyns: take þe stones out; and wip dates quartered and piked clene. And couere the coffyn, and bake it wel, and serue it forth.

GODE COOKERY TRANSLATION:

Tart de Brymlent. Take figs & raisins, & wash them in wine, and grind them small with apples & pears clean picked. Take them up and put them in a pot with wine and sugar. Take very fresh salmon boiled, or cod or haddock, and mince them small, & do there-to white powders & whole spices & salt, & boil it. And when it is cooked enough, take it up and do it in a vessel, and let it cool. Make a pie shell an inch deep & do the filling there-in. Place on top of this damson prunes: take the stones out; and with dates quartered and picked clean. And cover the pie, and bake it well, and serve it forth.

INGREDIENTS:

- Figs, minced
- Apples, peeled, cored, & minced
- White wine
- Cooked Salmon, Cod, or Haddock meat, minced or shredded
- Salt
- One nine-inch pie shell with pastry lid
- Dates, quartered
- Raisins
- Pears, peeled, cored, & minced
- Sugar
- White Pepper
- Whole spices - Cinnamon Sticks, Black Pepper-corns, Cloves, Ginger, etc. - wrapped up in cheesecloth
- Pitted Prunes

DIRECTIONS:

- Place the figs, raisins, apples, & pears in a large pot; cover with wine and add sugar to taste - it should be just slightly sweet, but not overly so. Add fish, spices, & salt to taste. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to a simmer. Allow the mixture to cook until it has reduced and thickened. Remove the spices in cheesecloth. Remove the pot from the heat and let cool. Place the filling in the pie shell and arrange the prunes and dates on top. Cover with the pastry lid. Bake until pastry is a golden brown. Serve forth!



Officer Profile

Lord Levi von Strausberg – RAPIER OFFICER

I am the Terra Pomaria Rapier Marshal, and new Baronial Rapier Champion. I really enjoy helping new people learn to fence and improve over time, so that might be the best part of my officer role. In contrast, the most challenging part of my position is keeping up with paper work. I am not good at it. If someone was interested in taking over the Rapier Marshal responsibilities, I'd recommend they act as deputy or shadow an acting officer.



I have been playing in the SCA for around ten years. Fencing and rapier initially drew me to the organization. I've enjoyed fencing for a long time, and after college I met the demo crew at the Canterbury Faire. I have been stabbing my friends ever since! I remain primarily active in the martial activities and service where I am able. Arts and Sciences interests me, but intimidates me, as well. I find research and documentation challenging. Martial activities keep me moving, and I enjoy learning more about how to fight with a sword. There are so many people with something to share, and each new opponent is a new challenge. Service is just something I grew up with and I enjoy helping people. I also enjoy learning new crafting skills, be it weaving or painting, armor making or wood working. Unfortunately, I don't have much call to use most of them in my day-to-day.



I feel making friends and building new relationships has been my greatest success in the SCA. All the people I have met and become friends with - seeing them grow and find their place, and then explore new things—has been amazing! I am a Sergeantry candidate at the moment, and someday I would like to make Peer. Becoming a Knight sounds fun, but I like fencing so MOD (Master of Defense) is also a possibility.

Looking back, any demo I was at make up some of my favorite memories from playing in the SCA. Getting to hang out with friends, new and old, and share what I know or talk about the fun of the SCA and what we do makes for a great time!

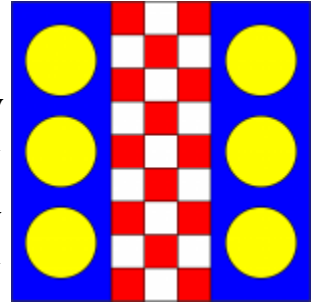
I am willing to share whatever I know with newcomers to the Barony. I am glad to pass on. Advice I would give to newcomers just starting in the SCA is to feel welcome and explore. Try everything that catches your eye, even if only once. Ask questions, and most importantly, have fun. But don't ask me jokes. I know a few but when put on the spot my mind goes blank.



Officer Profile

Her Ladyship Melannei Athenaios - CHANCELLOR OF THE EXCHEQUER

I am the Baronial Exchequer (or local financial officer in modern terms). My current term started in May, but I have held this office for a full term before and served as contingency deputy on and off for the past 8 years. I've also been Chronicler and Chamberlain, as well as stewarding a few events. What can I say? I enjoy spreadsheets and numbers! I also get to see happy faces when I hand someone a check!



"People get funny about money," is a phrase often said in Exchequer training. It doesn't often cause problems, but it's important to cover all the bases just in case. That's probably the most challenging part of my position, so I am big on documenting financial discussions and getting receipts etc. It's a little extra time but well worth it. For anyone interested in taking on this role, this is one position that I recommend someone becoming a deputy for at least three months, so that they can sit in on finance committee discussions and work through at least one quarterly report with the current Exchequer. You also need to take formal exchequer training, which you might actually be able to access online now.



I joined the SCA in the summer of 2009. My husband and I tried to get involved back in college but that local group was not very welcoming to college students. When we moved here, we knew people who had recently joined and were well set up to dive in feet first! The Barony has always been so welcoming and supportive! I've always been interested in history and ancestry, especially how they did the everyday tasks that we either outsource or have changed so much due to technology. The interest I initially pursued however, was Exchequer and service. I agreed to be Deputy Exchequer within two months of my first event.

I jumped in feet first with service, and that is where I have been most active for the first decade of my time in the SCA. Things like Exchequer, Chronicler and Chamberlain were easier to do than arts when my kids were really little. Now that they are older, I've been branching out to Arts & Sciences. I really enjoy scribal illumination and have been focusing on that lately. I've developed a lot of organizational skills further by performing my officer duties in the SCA. I only wish I could extend those skills better into my normal day-to-day activities! On the other side of things, I feel like my artistic endeavors in the SCA are helping me with my confidence in doing modern artistic endeavors.





Officer Profile

In regard to my goals in the SCA, I'm working on finding a balance between service and enjoyment. It's easy to get so focused on helping the SCA world go round that I lose sight of what draws me to it and gives me joy. Part of that joy is found in service, so I can't cut it out entirely! Keeping that balance is a real focus for me right now. And honestly, developing friendships and extended families within the SCA is the greatest part of the experience for me.

I have so many great memories from my time in the SCA! But the times that I really enjoy are the conversations. At the last event I went to, we sat down and chatted for hours by candlelight. I also enjoy helping behind the scenes with retinue and watching the faces of people being recognized in court. It's like being a part of the magic.

When I meet a newcomer, I mainly want to learn what they are interested in. Most likely I can share a shallow knowledge of the topic, but I can also help them connect with people who can share more. I'm happy to share scribal supplies and help them try out illumination, and I can teach what I know of cordmaking and weaving.

Additionally, advice that I would give newcomers is you don't have to be "period perfect" from day one or even day 792. Budgets and ability don't always allow for a period mode of doing things and sometimes it's just not worth it! I won't give up my modern shoes for anything, because I don't enjoy events if my feet hurt! But we ask that you make an attempt at period clothing and there are many people that can help with that! In the meantime, our Barony has a spectacular loaner garb selection. For people returning to the SCA, I just want them to know that we are glad to have them back in whatever way they are up for! Many people struggle with the same service/joy balance that I do and leave when they have lost that balance. If you just want to play, join us! If you feel up to serving again, dip the toe in slowly. We are just glad to have you with us again.

BTW, how did someone become a medieval executioner? You had to *axe* nicely.

- Nothing to report. Unable to make it to meeting due to illness.

Exchequer

(05/2022-05/2024)

- Winter's End's gate reconciliation went smoothly, and everything balanced. Thank you, Wystan, and your gate staff!
- The US Bank account has been opened! I will be requesting approval to purchase checks and such from the finance committee. Once I receive the checks, I will close the Bank of America account. That account currently has a **\$3,887.08** balance and US Bank has **\$2,000** for a total of **\$5,887.08**. This matches the ledger.

- The Finance Committee met after the January business meeting on 1/16. The budget that I proposed was approved. I will e-mail officers their budget amounts and have attached the budget for the Privy.

- Stonehenge Farms currently holds a \$300 credit for the Barony, and has been open to either refund those funds or put them towards a future event. The Finance Committee voted to request a refund if no event bids for that site have been received by the February business meeting.

- Christmas Caryl presented a \$550 bid for a Marshallate event that would focus on Rapier, Heavy and Cut & Thrust activities. She proposed that there be no site fee to help encourage attendance, but that donations be requested. We

discussed that the event would probably operate at a loss but recognized a need to grow the marshallate community. The Finance Committee approved the bid as proposed, with the plan that the donations exceed the costs for the event, proceeds will be focused on supporting marshallate activities. - The committee also discussed two bids via e-mail, due to the short time frame for the events.
- Luther and Zulaikha submitted a bid for Bar Gemels with Fortune as supervising event steward. The site contract at Camp Taloali was negotiated down to \$3,000 which is about \$1,000 higher than previous years, but is still much lower than their advertised rental fees. The total event bid was for \$4,360 with a member weekend fee of \$25, daytrip of \$15, and pre-reg meal plan of \$25. A la carte prices would vary depending on meals. We felt that the \$400 kitchen budget was not enough considering rising food costs, and increased the total amount approved to \$4,560 to allow for an increase to \$600 for the kitchen.

- Christmas submitted a bid for July Coronation this year with Her Highness Lindis as supervising event steward. The event would take place at Powerland Heritage Park. The total bid was for \$9,075.



of funds that are not earmarked for other events or the operating budget. I advised the committee that we would need a loan of \$8,100 if we chose to go forward with the bid. The bid had a conservative estimate of attendance which would provide more than \$3,000 income above event costs. Concerns were raised that this would risk burn out of our volunteers, as we have already approved two bids for events that aren't on our normal schedule and Long & Short is less than a month after Coronation. Christmas detailed ways that volunteers were being recruited outside of the Barony. The committee approved submitting the bid to kingdom with the loan request of \$8,100.

- Volunteers are okay with tearing down Sunday and no official activities will be held.

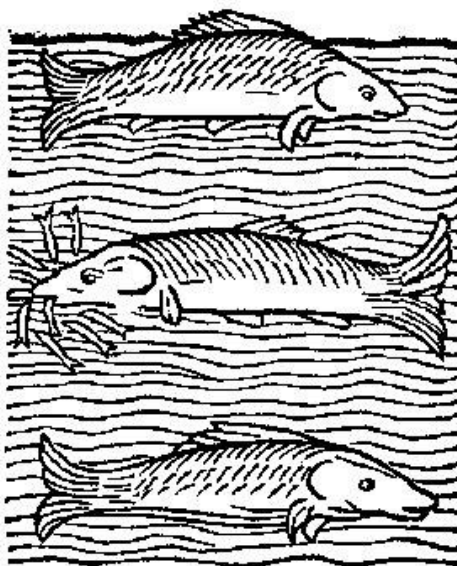
Old Business
